THE IEEE Arab Academy for Science & Technology (AAST) Student Branch kicked off the new academic year with a Student Professional Awareness Venture (SPAV) entitled 'Leading Your Career, Leading Your Society'. This event, held on 10–18 September 2005, provided young graduates and senior students with the information and guidance they need to be effective contributors to their society through educational institutions, government agencies and corporations.

A prerequisite to meet this end is, of course, professional awareness, which was the major theme of the conference. We were fortunate to have the support of the R8 Student Activities Committee, Kurt Richter (Leadership Workshop Coordinator and Trainer), and Nikola Milivojevic who presented a set of excellent, interactive workshops during the SPAV.

The nine-day event was divided into 3 phases:

- Awareness of opportunities after graduation & technology trends
- Development of professional awareness skills
- Job fair and exhibition

We invited company representatives to the job fair at the end, specifically to talk to our students about the work and training opportunities available to them.

SPAV 2006 Conference Phases

The SPAV 2006 agenda is divided into five main phases which take the participant through a package of awareness and professional development training that should help build a constructive career.

1- Beyond Graduation- Responsibilities & Opportunities

The inauguration day of the conference aims to enlighten the graduates with the educational prospects, governmental initiatives and corporate directions and opportunities available after graduation. This starts with introducing the responsibilities every graduate has to the development of society, and is achieved through an awareness session. We then move on to the opportunities graduates can seek to achieve their aspirations. Graduate education programs, diplomas and government scholarships are to be conveyed to the participants. Sessions on MCIT & government directions and initiatives such as the E-Gov and VoIP will follow. To complete the education-government-corporate triangle, corporate representatives shall be concluding by discussing the opportunities available and qualifications they seek in fresh graduates.

2- Career Development- Job Hunting & Career Preparation

After the diverse set of awareness sessions made in the first day we now move on to the actual career development stage. Setting career objectives through advice on investigating personal qualifications and long term aspirations will help guide and motivate the audience. After this career counseling, effective job hunting is discussed where the graduates are directed to different channels of accessing the job market. Once a job is accessed a person needs to prepare an effective CV which should lead him to the interview- therefore constructive CV preparation and detailed interview advice conclude this phase.

3- Exhibition

A one day Exhibition will serve to provide more information to the participants on all the aspects and opportunities covered during the venture. Exhibitors involved with the conference will be able to showcase all their new technologies/educational programs/professional training/society involvement to eager the participants, thereby also generating interest in their company. In this way, the conference will mutually benefit both the exhibitors and participants by providing insight, education, enlightenment, and exposure - IEEE.

4- Professional Development Training

A large part of the interview process in many corporations focuses on assessing the professional skills of the candidates. This phase of the conference focuses on offering three professional development workshops- Effective communication, Management, and Entrepreneurship.

5- Participant Assessment – Resume reviewing and mock interviews

After the awareness sessions, career preparation and professional development workshops the participants are assessed by reviewing newly prepared resumes and conducting mock interviews. Candidates shall be told of their qualifying points and notified of where they need to further develop their skills for a better overall presentation.
