Open Access (OA)

Open Access means unrestricted access to peer-reviewed scholarly research articles or publications that are digital, online and free-of-charge. The OA enables users to read, download, copy, distribute or print the articles or publications, and use them lawfully, without any financial, legal, or technical barriers.

Benefits of Open Access for:

Researchers

- Open Access offers researchers online and barrier-free access to the required resources.
- Enhances interdisciplinary research.
- Accelerates the pace of research, discovery and innovation.

Research Institutions

- Open Access helps institutions provide what their readers need.
- · Contributes to core mission of advancing knowledge.
- · In the long-term, Open Access may assist in resolving budgetary problems due to the increased costs of journals subscriptions.

Research Funders

- . Open Access increases the return on their investment in research by allowing the results of that research more widely available.
- · Helps in creating a transparent publishing environment.
- Encourages greater interaction, faster developments and innovation in research.

Authors

- · Open Access provides authors with a world wide audience.
- . Increases the visibility, readership and impact of their work.
- Open Access widens opportunities for funding and international collaboration.



Paths of Open Access:

Green Open Access



Researchers deposit (self-archive) their peer-reviewed journal article in a central or institutional Open Access Repository.

Gold Open Access



Researchers publish their manuscripts in journals that offer free access to articles on its website, and are available to users free-of-charge and immediately following publishing.


