The Serabit El-Khadim Inscriptions: Formulaic Approach Ahmed Mansour

Hathor Temple, located at Serabit el-Khadim hill in South Sinai; has a unique collection of Hieroglyphic texts, which dates back to the Old Kingdom, Middle Kingdom and New Kingdom. Those texts were recorded on limestone or on the walls of the Temple, which remains nothing of it.

The space was limited to record the mining expedition and God temple's religious texts, so the ancient Egyptian had to use the important and well known formulas record in this kind of Temples in mining regions. This research records the most important textual formulas in Serabit el-Khadim, and their importance on stelae and temple's wall, in addition to the textual construction. The research refers to the importance of Hathour as a goddess of Turquoise, through the repetition of her name mentioned in this research. Finally, there are some useful results for researchers.
