This research is an analytical study of god Nehebkau, and the relationship with Heliopolis city and its' main Gods through the Pyramid Texts and Tombs Texts, and *Book of the Dead*, in addition to the discoveries related to god Nehebkau in Heliopolis.

The research deals with the god's role in the Temples of Ra, and how it was important to have his funerary chapel at the great temple of Heliopolis during the New Kingdom. This study highlights the prestige that god Neheb had among the Ennead of Heliopolis, although it was one of the visiting gods of the city, and its relationship with god Ra –Atum, his help with his boat in the morning journey in the skies, also his funerary role in presenting food to the deceased. God Neheb-Kau was one of the forty-two judges in the dead court of Universal Heliopolis gods.
